

He said as far as he could determine, there had been no violation of regulations.

They had talked at length with Corrigan and State Atty. Abraham S. Ullman both before going

Mill River, a small stream near the Sears store, and Lake Whitney, a public reservoir into which the stream drains.

### BOYS HOOK SACK

The body was recovered about three miles from the \$16,000 ranch-type home of the Ruotolos at a point where the lake front is heavily wooded. About 1,000 police and volunteers had searched an area extending a half mile in every direction from the Sears store after the kidnaping.

The sack containing the body was spotted floating on the lake by the three boys who hooked it with a fish line and towed it ashore.

Police said the kidnaper, believed to have been a dark-skinned, dumpy woman, apparently abandoned the baby shortly after carrying her from the store crowded with about 4,000 Saturday shoppers. They said the baby had been dead for several days.

There still was no solid clue to the identity of the kidnaper, but it was believed the plastic potato sack might give them something to work on.

# Bayonets Take Negro Pupils Past 500 in Kentucky Mob

Racial tension flared up in the Texas-Arkansas border city of Texarkana Thursday as bayonets of Kentucky National Guardsmen opened a path through a fist-swinging mob for nine Negroes to enter the Sturgis, Ky., high school.

In the Texarkana incidents, all occurring on the Texas side of the city, a shotgun blast was fired into a Negro-owned service station and a cross was burned and a Negro hanged in effigy at Texarkana Junior College, where two Negro girls enrolled yesterday.

A mob of 500 yelling townspeople clashed with National Guardsmen in Sturgis as the nine Negroes, who had walked a mile to the previously all-white school, reached the building.

After the Negroes were inside, the guardsmen pushed the crowd

back across the street where members shouted threats that the Negroes "won't be in school all day."

Riot gun and bayonet-armed guardsmen formed a solid protective wall around the Negroes as they filed out at the end of the day's session.

The crowd hurled taunts and surged forward as the Negro students entered waiting cars. Guardsmen prevented anyone from reaching either the students or the cars.

At approximately 100 white
