

NEGROES TAKEN FROM JAIL AT PILOT POINT

DENTON, Dec. 14.—Two negroes who were arrested at Pilot Point, in the north part of the county, and placed in jail there yesterday on suspicion in connection with the disappearance of two horses from the farm of another negro there, were missing from the city jail when officers went to give them their breakfast this morning.

Editor W. J. Miller of the Pilot Point Post Signal found tacked on the door of his office when he went to work the following note: "Both of the negroes were given what they had coming, let this be a warning to all negro loafers. Negroes, get a job or leave town."

The note was written in pencil on a piece of white paper and was unsigned, report received here said. Officers said they had been unable to find any trace of the two negroes. The horses that were missed were found back in the owner's lot yesterday morning. This is the second time in recent months that negroes have disappeared from the Pilot Point calaboose and a note of warning left at the newspaper office there.
