### Adlai Points to Poverty; Ike Stresses Prosperity

Republicans and Democrats pulled out the stops Monday in Labor Day appeals for support from American workers.

President Eisenhower released a report which declared that the level of America's economy "has never been higher in peace or war."

Adlai E. Stevenson, his Democratic opponent, charged that there are still "ugly patches of poverty and insecurity" affecting almost one-fifth of all American families.

30,000 SEE ADLAI

The biggest holiday show was in Detroit, where Stevenson paraded past an estimated 100,000 people and spoke to about 30,000 in Grand Cadillac Square. He called it a "bold invention" in the social field so that the lives of all Americans may be enriched in the years ahead.

Stevenson, who made a five-hour speech foray into Michigan, declared at Muskegon that the Democrats reject the idea of "a millionaires' Cabinet, a labor law aimed against labor and a National Labor Relations Board packed with management representatives."

In Pontiac, Stevenson lashed out at GOP foreign policies and Secretary of State Dulles. He accused the Eisenhower administration of repudiating the Truman pledge to liberate the Poles, Czechs and other satellite peoples.

### Deputy Shot And Trooper Is Stabbed

CLINTON, Tenn., Sept. 3 (AP)—Milwaukee kept the peace in mob-battered Clinton tonight with an iron fist, but other anti-integration incidents erupted over a wide surrounding area, including a knifing at Dayton 100 miles away.

In the Dayton incident, five men were reported to have taken out their resentment over guard occupation of Clinton on two young men on their way to routine weekly drill. One of the guardsmen was knifed about the face and hospitalized after arrival at drill quarters.

The other incidents:  
1. A crowd of undetermined size gathered in Oliver Springs about 20 miles to the southwest and were reported on its way here. The guard posted two tanks in the supposed path of the crowd.

2. Oliver Springs police reported four or five dynamite blasts had been set off in the town's residential section late tonight after unfounded rumors were spread that Oliver Springs schools would be integrated tomorrow.

Later, violence erupted on Main Street as a Negro man fired a pistol shot at a white member of a frenzied mob which all but took over this East Tennessee community.

Anderson County Sheriff Glad Woodward said a mob of about 250 was holding sway on the town's main street, rocking cars on their springs and generally terrorizing motorists. The scene was similar to a mob demonstration Friday night at nearby Clinton.

Woodward said the Negro who fired the shot was in one of the cars being bounced around by the mob, and he got out, blazed away with his gun and wounded the white man in the arm.

He then gunned his car and sped away with another Negro, Woodward said, and had not been apprehended.

Later a deputy sheriff was shot in the shoulder, apparently by mob members as he drove his car through town.

Earlier, Police Chief Fred Giles reported two dynamite blasts were set off in the Negro community, on the outskirts of the city in Roane County. This town of 1,000 population sits astride the county lines of Anderson, Morgan and Roane Counties, about 12 miles west of Clinton.

Giles said the mob was getting out of hand, and law enforcement

### Girl Plunges To Death From Plane

SAN RAFAEL, Calif., Sept. 3 (AP)—A University of California coed was reported to have fallen from a small plane in the rugged hills between Mt. Tamalpais and Sinson Beach this afternoon.

Her body had not been recovered.

#### OPENED DOOR

Stanley Gordon, 28, Belvedere, told San Rafael police that Flora Elizabeth Anderson, 22, San Francisco, "opened the door" of the rented plane he was piloting and fell from about 1,000 feet.

Gordon and the girl rented the small plane from San Francisco Bay Airport. Gordon flew back alone. He called police immediately. And policeman Tom Cheetham said Gordon was nervous and trembling when he told him the following story:

"They were flying in the area over Sinson Beach when the girl started opening the door of the plane."

"Gee," the girl said, "we're awfully high."

"Don't do that," Gordon said. "You are throwing the plane off balance."

#### PLANS DIVES

But the girl kept opening the door farther against the air pressure. And Gordon noticed that she was sitting with her legs over the side of the plane just as it went into a dive.

When he came out of the dive, the girl was gone and he flew back to the airport.

Gordon was being questioned by Martin County Dist. Atty. W. O. Weissich.
