U. S. ASKS DAMAGES FOR DOWNED PLANE

WASHINGTON, Aug. 31 (U.P.)—The United States Friday night accused Red China of making an "unjustified" attack on a U. S. Navy patrol plane shot down last week off the China coast. It demanded compensation for the loss of the plane and its 16 crewmen.

A joint statement by the State and Defense Departments said available evidence indicates "the attack was made without warning; that it was unjustified; and that the responsibility lies with the Chinese Communist regime."

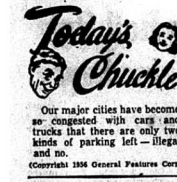
